Checkerboard Center Quilt, Version 2, Child

This kit contains 18 squares of color A fabric, 17 squares of color B fabric, 4 narrow strips for the inner border and 4 wide strips of theme fabric for the outer border.

<u>Outer border</u> $-\frac{3}{4}$ yards theme print fabric, cut four -6" wide strips

Inner border – ¹/₃ yard fabric – cut four 2¹/₂" wide strips

<u>Checkerboard</u> – $\frac{1}{2}$ yard of color A, cut three – 5 $\frac{1}{2}$ " wide strips into 18 – 5 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 5 $\frac{1}{2}$ " squares

 $\frac{1}{2}$ yard of color B, cut three – 5 $\frac{1}{2}$ " wide strips into 17 – 5 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 5 $\frac{1}{2}$ " squares

Backing – 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ yards fabric

<u>Batting</u> – 42" x 52"

Use a ¼ inch seam throughout construction. To make the checkerboard center, sew the squares together in rows of 5 squares across. Row A starts and ends with a color A fabric square and Row B starts and ends with a color B square. Row A: 4 rows; Row B: 3 rows.





Sew the rows together starting with Row A and alternating the rows and ending with Row A. This forms the checkerboard center as shown. Sew the narrow inner border strips to the center checkerboard, starting on the <u>long</u> sides of the rectangle. Press and trim. Add wide border strips, sides first, then top and bottom. Press and trim.

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This blanket can be finished using the traditional method, which uses a binding, or the 'envelope' method, which uses no binding. Quilt or tie at least every $3\frac{1}{2}$ to 4 inches. Quilting in the ditch looks nice and reinforces the blanket. Quilting $\frac{1}{2}$ " around the outside edges gives a more finished look when using the 'envelope' method.

Finished quilt is approximately 40" x 50".
