# **Agency Spotlight: Community C.A.R.E. Connections**

Community Care Connections (CCC) is a 501 (c)3 nonprofit organization that provides needed goods and services to highly vulnerable and disadvantaged people in Maricopa County by means of collaborations with business, government, charitable and educational institutions. The organization was founded in 1996 with the goal of providing help, compassion and respect to victims and under-served populations. C.A.R.E. stands for Compassion and Respect for Everyone.

CCC connects people and organizations that want to help with individuals and organizations that need help. Their Assistance for Victims of Domestic Violence Program addresses the needs of victims of domestic violence by providing donated household goods, personal items and everyday living supplies to licensed domestic violence shelters. AZ Blankets 4 Kids welcomes the opportunity to supply comfort blankets through this program as they are needed for children sheltered by Autumn House, Chrysalis Scottsdale and Phoenix, DeColores, (Salvation Army), Faith House, My Sister's Place, Sojourner Center and Fresh Start 's Women's Resource Center.

CCC's Medical Volunteer Program has matched over 400 Arizona State University health care students with hands-on clinical service opportunities in Maricopa County public health clinics and immunization sites. Technical Assistance for Seniors Homebound Program addresses the problems of isolation, loneliness and depression among homebound seniors by providing them with computers, internet connectivity and training. Since April, 2002, CCC has installed 100 computers and has 85 seniors online or in training. Each year CCC's Special Events Program provides hun-

fices of Secretary and Vice President. The Secretary position involves taking minutes at all Board meetings and occasional correspondence. ### **Blanket Guidelines**

We have developed the following blanket guidelines based on feedback from our recipient agencies.

#### **Materials**

100% cotton fabrics in child friendly patterns and colors. For knitted or crocheted blankets, please use washable, acrylic yarns. We have had an increasing number of requests for flannel receiving blankets and fleece blankets.

#### Construction

All blankets should be machine quilted or tied every four to six inches with a square knot (except Preemies). These blankets are well-used and need to be durable and washable. If tied, agencies request that we use pearl cotton or embroidery thread as opposed to yarn. Visit our website at www.azblankets4kids.com for pattern ideas or use your own.

If you are using a kit provided by AZ Blankets 4 Kids, *please follow the directions* provided to ensure consistent finished sizes.

# S.O.S. Calling All Volunteers

We need blankets! As our organization grows, the number of agencies contacting us with requests for blankets is growing as well. We are facing challenges in meeting the blanket needs of our existing agencies. While we do not wish to refuse new organizations that meet our criteria, we can only begin deliveries to them as our blanket supply permits. We are making every effort to increase our supply of blankets—please help!

How you can help:

Knitted or crocheted blankets should be closely knit to protect tiny fingers and toes (not suitable for preemies).

#### Sizes

**Preemies** 16" x 16" to 18"x 18" Blankets must have flannel backing, no batting and minimal quilting. Either stitch from corner to corner in an X or stitch 2" from edges on all four sides. Do not tie. Infant-themed colors and prints are preferred.

Infant 36" x 36" or larger

**Toddler** 36" x 44" (one yard of fabric)

Child 36" x 44" or larger

Teens 40" x 60" or larger

We often receive requests for more blankets suitable for boys or in gender neutral colors and patterns, especially in the Teen size. Thank you for keeping our teenaged recipients in mind.

Attend an AZ Blankets 4 Kids bee—and as always, bring a friend!

*Host a bee*—to meet a specific request or to supply blankets wherever they're needed.

Adopt an agency—your group could address the blanket needs of one of our new agencies.

*Spread the word*—help recruit AZ Blankets 4 Kids volunteers among your acquaintances.

*Invite an AZ Blankets 4 Kids representative* to meet with your group.
