Kelli Nemec and her team used up two rolls of batting and matched many tops and backs. Barb Middleton had purchased fabric for backs and almost 100 yards were used at this bee. 87 finished quilts were turned in with only 12 coming from outside the bee!

The Door Prize Basket was won by Lana Guessford, a winter visitor from Iowa, and the ever-popular 50-50 raffle was won by Sue Mott from Quail Run Park.

HOLIDAY VILLAGE BEE ~ January 25, 2014

On a beautiful day at Holiday Village in Mesa,125 completed quilts were turned in to Distribution. Fifty-seven attendees at this bee, (fourteen board members and forty-three volunteers) not only machine-quilted, hand-tied quilts, sewed binding on quilts, sewed quilt tops from kits, but they also layered quilts with two large rolls of batting and sprayed all of the layered quilts. It was indeed a very productive day.





Sally Tucek and her ladies did a great job setting up and coordinating the bee. They served Costco Turkey Roll-Ups, chips and fruit salad for lunch. Our own Karen Johnston from

Quilting Bee Door-Prize Baskets

Have you ever won one of those gorgeous door-prize baskets at a AZB4Kids Bee? Have you ever wondered where they come from or who makes them? Well, Carole Willsey, one of the AZB4Kids Board Members, is the dedicated volunteer who designs and constructs a door-prize basket for each bee.

Why does she make them? Where does she get all the goodies? The answer to these questions is YOU, OUR VOLUNTEERS. The baskets are created because YOU, our volunteers, donate all kinds of items beyond fabric. It is YOUR generosity that allows Carole to put the baskets together. For example, at our last board meeting Carole was given two baskets, three bottles of Bath and Body Works hand soap, a panel for sewing an Easter bunny, quilt storage tissue, a silicone iron rest, 3 aprons to decorate, 5 spools of great thread, decorative buttons, 2 coordinated

bundles of fat quarters, 2 jelly rolls and 23 assorted fat quarters. Everything in the basket is donated, including the basket itself. The only thing she buys is the silk flowers or balloons that she uses to make the door prize more attractive. AZB4K buys the cellophane. Carole not only fills the basket with lots of goodies, but decorates the basket according to a timely theme, Valentine's Day, Easter, etc

The winners are always very excited to receive these beautiful gifts. Thank you, Carole, for your hard work and creativity. Your baskets add to the fun we have at the bees!

ATTENTION ALL QUILTERS

AZB4K needs:

- More child (40" x 46/48") and teen (40" x 55/60") size quilts
- More boy-themed quilts
- Child and teen quilts can take *some* darker, more adult fabric but spruce it up with color and child friendly material.
- Infant quilts less than 36" x 38" are difficult to place and may be used as lap pads, etc.
- Dark adult fabrics should not be used for infant/toddler quilts. These are charity quilts but they will become some child's treasure. Please remember that when selecting fabrics.

What does this mean?

It means that you can make a cash contribution to AZ Blankets 4 Kids and get a "dollar for dollar" credit on your AZ tax return. Any taxpayer who has a tax liability can get the credit. Those who file as "single" may claim a maximum credit of \$200. Taxpayers who file as "married filing joint" may claim a maximum credit of \$400. You report your donation on Arizona Department of Revenue Form 321.

Your cash donations will help us buy batting among other supplies that are needed for our volunteers to continue making blankets at our bees. Help us help the kids and get your money back at tax time.
